




U.S. lawmakers are looking to step in and solve some of the country's supply-chain problems.

Republican Sen. Marco Rubio of Florida and Democratic Rep. Ro Khanna of California are proposing steps to force federal agencies to take the lead in preventing future product shortages while better coordinating existing federal programs to build up domestic manufacturing.

The **WSJ's** Katy Stech Ferek reports their legislation would force leaders at cabinet-level agencies to identify weaknesses in U.S. supply chains that could hurt national security and domestic manufacturing growth. The nascent effort builds on previous congressional attempts to reduce reliance on other countries, such as China.

The plan is the latest move in Washington to respond to supply-chain disruptions that have roiled the economy, and recently have affected products ranging from infant formula to semiconductors. Prospects for passage aren't clear, but a stronger government hand in supply chains looks likely to grow.



The hierarchy of U.S. ports is getting shaken up as broad trends in shipping collide with new pressures from the world's shifting global trade map.

Companies across many industries are rethinking how and where they ship goods after years of relying heavily on the western U.S. as an entry point.

The **WSJ Logistics Report's** Paul Berger writes that a growing lineup of shippers is betting that ports in the East and the South can save them time and money while reducing risk. Their reasons range from fears of a dockworkers strike along the West Coast that would revive pandemic-era bottlenecks to a reduced dependence on production in China. The logistical challenges of spreading imports along the East Coast and the Gulf Coast are massive. But for some shippers, a push to minimize risk and increase flexibility changes supply-chain calculations, and that could help reset domestic distribution maps across the U.S.

- Georgia's Port of Savannah is converting its multi-use ocean terminal to a container-only facility.
- California will spend \$175 million to improve truck access to the **Port of Oakland**.

JANUARY 2023 - TOUR OF WOOLSEY HALL - WSU CAMPUS



Wayne and Kay Woolsey Hall, a \$60 million, 125,000-square-foot academic building on Wichita State University's Innovation Campus is the new home of the W. Frank Barton School of Business.

Woolsey Hall is named for the Wichita couple who provided the lead gift to the WSU Foundation's fundraising campaign. The business school plans to move to the new building in 2022 from Clinton Hall, which has been its home since 1970.

The structure is a three-level, LEED-certified building — the first building on the Wichita State campus to be LEED-certified. It was designed by the architectural team of Gastinger-Walker of Kansas City and Gensler Chicago. Dondlinger Construction of Wichita won the competitive bid to build the facility.
